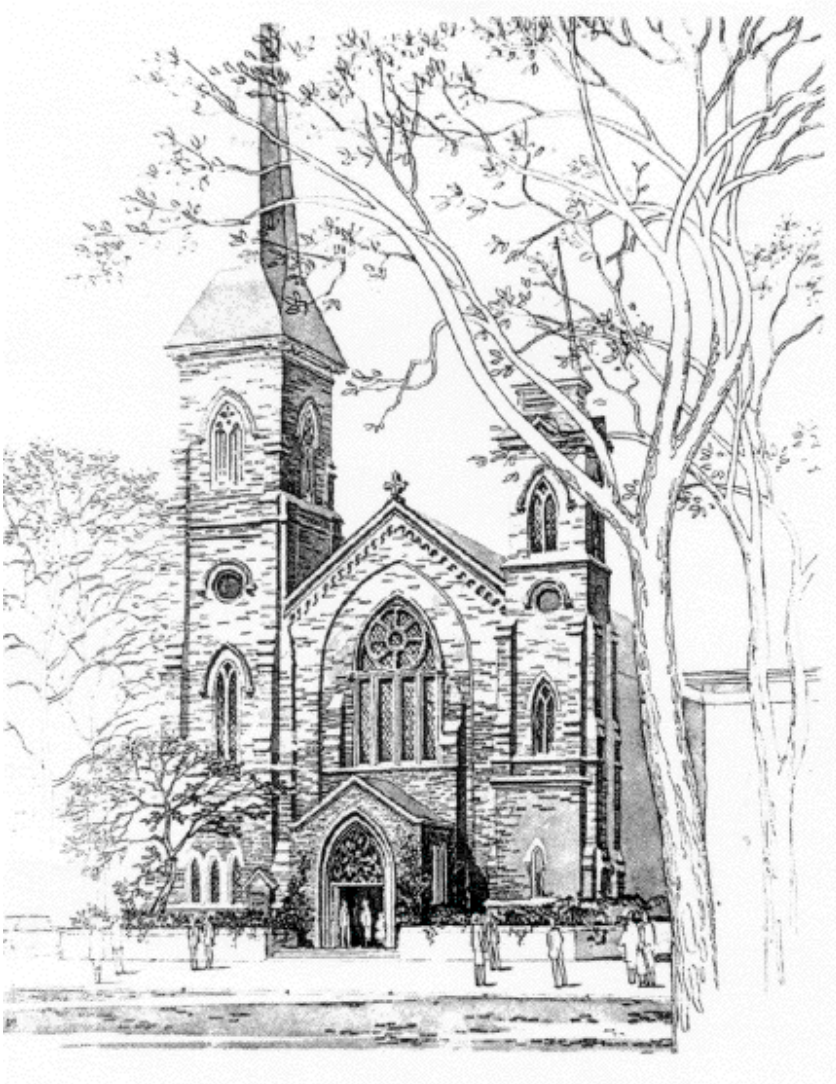

THE SECOND LESSON

Luke 16:1-13

¹ Then Jesus said to the disciples, “Someone who was rich had a manager, and charges were brought that the manager was squandering the property. ² So the rich person summoned the manager and said, ‘What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer.’ ³ Then the manager thought, ‘What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴ I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.’ ⁵ So, summoning the rich person’s debtors one by one, the manager asked the first, ‘How much do you owe my master?’ ⁶ The debtor answered, ‘A hundred jugs of olive oil.’ The manager said, ‘Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.’ ⁷ Then the manager asked another, ‘And how much do you owe?’ That debtor replied, ‘A hundred containers of wheat.’ The manager said, ‘Take your bill and make it eighty.’ ⁸ And the rich person commended the unjust manager for acting shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than

are the children of light. ⁹ And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unjust wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes.

¹⁰ “Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is unjust in a very little is unjust also in much. ¹¹ If, then, you have not been faithful with the unjust wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹² And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? ¹³ No person who is enslaved can serve two masters at the same time; for such a person will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.”
