

THE SECOND LESSON

Luke 1:57-66

⁵⁷ Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. ⁵⁸ Her neighbors and relatives heard that God had shown great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her.

⁵⁹ On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him Zechariah after his father. ⁶⁰ But his mother said, "No; he is to be called John." ⁶¹ They said to her, "None of your relatives has this name." ⁶² Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him. ⁶³ He asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And all of them were amazed. ⁶⁴ Immediately Zechariah's mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. ⁶⁵ Fear came over all their neighbors, and all these things were talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. ⁶⁶ All who heard them pondered them and said, "What then will this child become?" Get Involved!

There are sign-up sheets at the Fayette St. entrance for greeters and Fellowship Hour hosts (Fellowship Hour will resume in the new year). The instructions for each role can be found below! If you are interested in reading during worship, please contact the office. Don't hesitate to ask questions about these roles.

Greeting Instructions

Greeters should arrive at the church by 10:10. The bulletins will already be placed at each entrance. One person should stand in the narthex (the foyer at the Townsend St. entrance) and one person should stand at the Fayette St. entrance. The person at the Fayette St. entrance should open the door for everyone who arrives. Both greeters should greet and welcome everyone who arrives and hand them each a bulletin. The Townsend St. greeter should ring the bell at 10:25 and stay in the narthex until Kenneth arrives at the narthex. The Fayette St. greeter should stay at that entrance until a few minutes after worship starts. If there is only one person signed up to greet, they should do so in the narthex.

Fellowship Hour Instructions

Before Sunday morning, the host can check with the office to see if any snacks are left over from the previous Sunday. The host can provide store-bought snacks, homemade treats, or a combination of the two. Things to consider are providing both savory and sweet options and making sure there are drinks. The Mission, Membership, and Outreach Committee has funds to subsidize Fellowship Hour purchases as well. On Sunday morning, the host should bring whatever snacks they choose and put them in the kitchen. When the final hymn begins, the host should leave worship and set up the food, cups, plates, and napkins in the Gathering Hall. Kenneth is always available to help!
