THE FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 2:1-5

¹ The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

² In days to come
the mountain of the house of God

*Please rise in body or spirit

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shall be established as the highest of the mountains
and shall be raised above the hills;
all the nations shall stream to it.

³ Many peoples shall come and say,
“Come, let us go up to the mountain of God,
to the house of the God of Jacob,
that God may teach us God’s ways
and that we may walk in God’s paths.”

For out of Zion shall go forth instruction
and the word of God from Jerusalem.

⁴ God shall judge between the nations
and shall arbitrate for many peoples;
they shall beat their swords into plowshares
and their spears into pruning hooks;
nation shall not lift up sword against nation;
neither shall they learn war any more.

THE SECOND LESSON

Matthew 1:1-17

¹ An account of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham.

² Abraham and Sarah were the parents of Isaac, and Isaac and Rebekah the parents of Jacob, and Jacob and Leah the parents of Judah and his brothers, ³ and Judah and Tamar the parents of Perez and Zerah, and Perez the father of Hezron, and Hezron the father of Aram, ⁴ and Aram of Aminadab, and Aminadab of Nahshon, and Nahshon of Salmon, ⁵ and Salmon and Rahab were the parents of Boaz, and Boaz and Ruth the parents of Obed, and Obed was the father of Jesse, ⁶ and Jesse was the father of King David.

And David and Bathsheba, the wife of Uriah, were the parents of Solomon, ⁷ and Solomon was the father of Rehoboam, and Rehoboam the father of Abijah, and Abijah of Asaph, ⁸ and Asaph of Jehoshaphat, and Jehoshaphat of Joram, and Joram of Uzziah, ⁹ and Uzziah was the father of Jotham, and Jotham of Ahaz, and Ahaz of Hezekiah, ¹⁰ and Hezekiah was the father of Manasseh, and Manasseh of Amos, and Amos of Josiah, ¹¹ and Josiah was the father of Jechoniah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon.

¹² And after the deportation to Babylon: Jechoniah was the father of Salathiel, and Salathiel of Zerubbabel, ¹³ and Zerubbabel of Abiud, and Abiud of Eliakim, and Eliakim of Azor, ¹⁴ and Azor was the father of Zadok, and Zadok of Achim, and Achim of Eliud, ¹⁵ and Eliud of Eleazar, and Eleazar of Matthan, and Matthan of Jacob, ¹⁶ and Jacob was the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called the Messiah.

¹⁷ So all the generations from Abraham to David are fourteen generations; and from David to the deportation to Babylon, fourteen generations; and from the deportation to Babylon to the Messiah, fourteen generations.

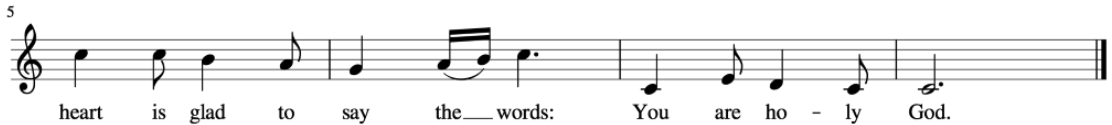
